


# Help Fund the Wapalanne South Hill Bathhouse



The Wapalanne South Hill Bathhouse was built in the 1930s to serve campers in the southernmost cabins (Cabins 1 - 6). Unfortunately, the building—which has showers, toilets, sinks, and changing areas—has fallen into disrepair and has been unusable for at least 5 years. All of the systems (i.e., plumbing, electrical, HVAC) need to be upgraded; the failing roof needs to be replaced. Without the bathhouse functioning, the campers in Cabins 1 - 6 must share the Wapalanne North Hill bathhouse facilities, which are not adequate to serve that many users.



The plan to restore the Bathhouse includes upgrading the shower room, installing modern toilets, sinks, changing areas, ADA-compliant shower and toilet stalls, and exterior landscaping that both fixes drainage issues and provides appropriate grading for all users' access. Rehabilitating the bathhouse would allow NJSOC to serve its current students more properly, expand the size of groups that can use the cabins, open cabin bath use to mobility-impaired users, and save another historic building on the NJSOC campus. If we can raise the funds to complete the project soon, we could have this important facility back on line for Summer 2026.



The cost for this project is \$149,500 That amount is broken down as:
